






Four problems with The Dark Knight:

- Individuals are complex and contradictory – we can never judge the whole by a part
- 2. People throughout society are products of life experience (including us)
- 3. No policy carries innate moral worthto think otherwise leads to dogma
- 4. Personal morals and political values are not the same thing

Four problems with The Puppet Master:

- 1. Few people possess the 'inhuman, superhuman' traits needed to control society for personal gain
- 2. There are self-evidently different electoral and policy priorities which 'the powerful' must juggle
- 3. The true problem with unregulated capitalism is that it's organic/ anarchic
- 4. By blaming 'elites' we shirk the hard questions of socialism

- 5. Direct challenges to Indirect challenges
- 6. Groupish, Individualist, Postmaterialist
- 7. Innocence to Awareness

How can we challenge the myths?

- Take on all language which implies bad faith or omnipotent control
- Do not fall into using the myths towards either right or left
- Reject the idea that the difference is about degrees of radicalism
- Stress the egalitarian possibilities of jettisoning the myths in favour of left pluralism

The alternative: Left pluralism

A democratic socialist politics which subscribes to the following analysis:

- We live in a democracy this implies pluralism
- There are a range of respectable ideals people strive for
- Few policies are inherently moral, even if they are right at a given time
- Society's problems are not usually deliberately authored
- * The power held by democratic governments, the media and business is finite
- Objectivity is more important than political faith in achieving our values
- There have been advances and setbacks, but there was no moment of 'original socialism' which was innately superior to today
- Cooperation with other countries is part of the modern world
- If we derive our passion solely from fighting an enemy, an elite or a looming dystopia then we stand for nothing
- Accepting the above makes us more likely, not less, to achieve progressive goals

Left pluralism - the alternative to left populism (some quotes)

"The world is messy, there are ambiguities. People who do really good stuff have flaws. The people who you are fighting may love their kids – and even share certain things with you." *Barack Obama*

"Identities are robustly plural, and the importance of one identity need not obliterate the importance of others." *Amartya Sen*

"The idea of New Labour was not to be a good opposition party, to protest loudly or have an 'influence' over events, but, rather, to take and hold on to the levers of power. Left pluralism - the alternative to left populism (some quotes cont.)

"It is telling the truth that makes us socialists rather than populists." Bridget Phillipson MP

"I am not a relativist; I do not say 'I like my coffee with milk and you like it without; I am in favour of kindness and you prefer concentration camps'... But I do believe that there is a plurality of values which men can and do seek, and that these values differ... If a man pursues one of these values, I, who do not, am able to understand why he pursues it... Hence the possibility of human understanding." *Isaiah Berlin*
